


Arts and Culture Summit

The Arts & Culture Summit in Boston is a pioneering gathering that unites leaders, funders, and advocates from diverse industries to develop sustainable cultural solutions. Initially launching with the Everyone250 initiative, which promotes equitable celebrations of America's 250th anniversary, the summit has expanded its focus to address equity, justice, and racial reconciliation post-pandemic and following the murder of George Floyd. It serves as a crucial platform for fostering meaningful discussions and forging partnerships that advance these goals within the arts and culture sector.





Embrace Honors MLK

During the Martin Luther King Jr. Holiday, Embrace Honors MLK provides a platform to center Black joy, a narrative often overlooked in discussions of racial justice. As the world witnesses the ongoing struggles against anti-Blackness, cultural division, and political stratification, this event serves as a beacon of solidarity, celebrating the vibrancy and strength of Rev. 

1965 Freedom March 60th Anniversary

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 23, 2025

The year 2025 marks the 60th Anniversary of the 1965 Freedom Rally. The rally took place on April 23, 1965, with over 20,000 people marching on Boston Common to protest racial imbalance in housing and schools. The march began at Carter Playground, at the corner of Columbus Ave., and ended at Boston Common. Martin Luther King led the march from Roxbury to Boston Common. As part of the Everyone 250 Initiative and other 250 celebrations, Embrace Boston, in collaboration with the City of Boston and other community partners, will recreate this historic march from Carter Playground in Roxbury to the Embrace Monument/Parkman Bandstand.





Embrace Ideas Festival

The Embrace Honors Juneteenth and Embrace Ideas Festival is an annual celebration rooted in arts, culture, and public scholarship. It culminates in the observance of the Juneteenth Holiday. This multi-day gathering convenes local, state, and national leaders to amplify anti-racism efforts, uplift unsung heroes, and envision transforming Boston by 2030.

One of the festival's core principles is its intentional alignment with Juneteenth, a vital holiday commemorating the emancipation of enslaved African Americans. By centering the festival around Juneteenth, Embrace Boston seeks to honor those who have long celebrated this occasion and extend an invitation to those who may be new to its significance, fostering a collective effort to construct a new national monument of remembrance and progress.


